He joined OSU in August 2016 as part of the Initiative for Food and AgriCultural Transformation (INFACT).

His research interests include research methods, the sociology of agriculture, and human dimensions of complex environmental systems. Though trained as a social scientist, a large share of his professional work has involved collaborations with engineers and natural scientists on interdisciplinary teams.
